Our church dates back to the 11th century. It is vital that we preserve it for future generations.


Urgent repairs are needed to our beautiful medieval church.

From the Middle Ages to Modern Times: A Brief History

St Peter's is a beautiful medieval church with examples of late medieval stain glass. Although the date of the foundation of the church is unknown, it is likely that there has been a church on this site since Anglo Saxon times.

A small stone church was in existence in 1158 and there are visible signs in the church today from the Norman Church such as the tympanum or canopy and one of the shafts in the south doorway.

Following extensions and further building in the 13th and 14th centuries, a rebuilding of the church began in 1470. The present tower seems to have been part of the new church and much of the 15th century glass still exists today.

The Church was re-ordered in 1871 and gives us the interior we see today. The works included the restoring of the medieval glass and the building work cost £2,300!

Other works have been completed since the 19th

Century; examples include replacing the reredos (screen) behind the altar in 1966 by Thompson (The Mouseman) of Kilburn; replacing the organ in 1989 and the gable-cross over the front porch as a Millennium project.

The roof, now in need of some repair work, was laid in 1968 and we now need to restore this beautiful church to good health for future generations to enjoy.
